John was a true gentleman, many people would say he was an amazing coach, mentor and friend. On Thursday 14th March we held a celebration of his life where everyone got to share their great memories they experienced with him, from having an inspirable chat with him to him coaching with his great knowledge of the game. Wreaths were laid down on our main pitch and a minute silence was held at 7:50 pm to hold respect for a gentleman who will forever be part of our club.



John joined the club just after the set up of the football element of Wendron Cricket Club and became heavily involved in the development and progress of our club. He was a very respected and loved man within our community, and his contribution to our club's development and players' individually was inspirational as he helped Wendron United to be at its current position today. A lot of us would say, John Clarke was and forever will be the key knowledge of our club.

During 1990/95, Mr Clarke and Peter Thorne worked together in making Wendron a force in local football. Peter stepped down as the first team manager for the beginning of the new season allowing John to take over. He helped many of our players the way they play then and now with his mentorship.
